A Year Like No Other

2020 promised to be a year of opportunity during which the LCS Education Foundation would extend its typical programs and achieve predictable milestones. As we now know, 2020 has certainly surprised us all!

The Foundation has played a very active role in responding to rapidly shifting needs and priorities by supporting our students and teachers as COVID-19 has dramatically changed the landscape of classroom instruction. The current pandemic has not only forced our schools to remodel educational delivery systems, but it has also highlighted inequities inherent in our society. As both **excellence** and **equity** are the tenets of our mission, the Education Foundation is committed to ensuring equal opportunities for success to all. So how have we responded?

With help from the community, we immediately responded to unanticipated needs to ensure a continuity of learning for all of our students. With over 60% of LCS students qualifying for free or reduced lunch, this has been especially crucial. Over the past few months, we have:

- ◆ provided school supplies required to complete continuity of learning activities to students who lacked those resources at home.
- ◆ collected over 8,000 plastic sheets from LCS teachers and businesses to support local PPE efforts before supply chains could catch up to demand.
- ◆ provided \$1,000 in incentives to help LCS teachers receive Google certification to build their virtual teaching skills as well as their classroom skills.
- ◆ purchased 6,000 grade-specific elementary books — from interactive fairy tales to beautifully illustrated and engaging science books — to distribute to 1,200 students who have limited access to books in their homes in order to minimize reading loss and build their home libraries during this extended time away from the classroom.
- ◆ helped to secure 300+ face masks for the LCS food distribution team.
- ◆ provided art materials to support enrichment activities to over 900 students at the elementary and middle school levels.

All of this was made possible thanks to special donations from organizations such as the Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation Youth Philanthropy Award, businesses such as Walmart, and individuals such as Lee and Sharon Ainslie. We don't know all that lies ahead for the 2020-2021 school year, but we do know that this year will be different from any other. As the LCS Education Foundation celebrates its **35th anniversary** and reaches its **\$1,000,000** mark for Classroom Innovation Grants since the start of this program, our commitment to excellence and equity for all of our students has not changed. With your support, we will continue to respond flexibly and effectively to whatever challenges our school system faces in the months to come. Thank you for your partnership in the past and your continued support as we look ahead to the future.

Excellence in Science and Stroobants Scholarships: Community Investment Provides Opportunities for Top Students

Thanks to the generosity of local donors, the Excellence in Science Scholarship awards \$30,000 to a graduating senior for outstanding achievement in science or engineering. This year's recipient, Laurel Logan, graduated from E.C. Glass High School and plans to focus on aerospace engineering, physics and computer science at Virginia Tech.

As a student at the Central Virginia Governor's School for Science and Technology, Laurel won recognition at local, regional and state science fairs for her research on the effects of different types of glass on the speed of light. She continued her study of light with an internship at Blue Ridge Optics. She was active in the marching band, chemistry club and the rock climbing club at E.C. Glass, and also completed an internship at Delta Star.

Laurel's love of science began with her interest in the physics behind music theory and the combination of "logic with the creativity of discovery." She would ultimately like to earn her PhD and work in research as a professor or at a firm. "I want to push my learning as far as I possibly can," she said in her scholarship application. "Thank you for making this opportunity available to me."



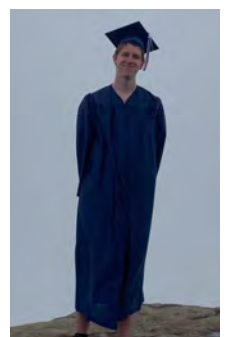
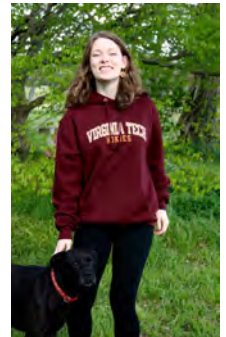
Receiving the Excellence in Science Scholarship in 2016, E.C. Glass graduate Zachry Martin studied engineering at the University of Virginia. He graduated this year with a major in systems engineering and a minor in economics and had the opportunity to combine much of the science and math concepts that he enjoyed in high school.

He participated in an academic internship in Berlin, Germany, where he worked for a small startup that created a search engine to connect electronic component customers with manufacturers. He became active in the International Council on Systems Engineering and worked to help other engineering students have the opportunity to study abroad. He also helped coach a successful 7th and 8th grade boys' recreational basketball team through the volunteer center at UVA.

Zachry recently started a job as an associate consultant at Application Consulting Group. He was attracted to the company because of its focus on using computer programming and software to analyze data and optimize performance, "which was one of my favorite aspects of the systems engineering curriculum at UVA."



Another major award is the Stroobants Excel Scholarship, which provides \$13,000 to an 11th grade student nominated for outstanding work in a career tech class in recognition of his or her scholarship, leadership and compassion for other students. Adam Palmer is the first student to receive this prestigious scholarship and is a 2020 graduate of Heritage High School. Adam will attend Central Virginia Community College to pursue an associate's degree in Engineering Technology and then plans to transfer to Virginia Tech's College of Engineering.

The warehouse also fills between 700 and 800 orders of educational materials and classroom rewards and incentives free of charge to teachers annually.

Perhaps most importantly, this program allows us to stay responsive whenever opportunities or challenges arise. During the COVID-19 outbreak, we used resources from the **Tools4Schools** Warehouse to supplement school supplies needed for at home learning kits and enrichment activities. This ensured that families who could not have provided the supplies required to complete assignments could work with their children and continue learning during this challenging period.

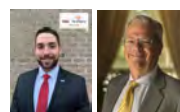
